T-Ball Division Bylaws

The Little League baseball rulebook will govern all play, these bylaws do not supersede anything in that rulebook, and are here to assist with normal gameplay.

Starting and Ending the Game Bylaw

- a. Home team sets up the field, this includes preparing the pitcher's mound, setting up the bases, getting the garbage can, dragging the infield, and chalking the baselines and batter's boxes.
- b. Visiting team takes down the field. This includes preparing the pitcher's mound, dragging the infield, putting the bases away in the equipment box (along with the tools), and taking trash to the dumpster.
- c. All managers and coaches are responsible for cleaning all trash from their respective dugouts.
- d. All teams must line up on their respective baseline for the Little League Pledge. Each team will send two (2) representatives to the pitcher's mound to recite the pledge.
- e. No new inning will begin after one (1) hour and thirty (30) minutes.
- f. Teams shall play no more than three (3) innings.

The Offense Bylaw

- a. The batting order will consist of all eligible players. Each batter will bat once in each inning played regardless of number of outs made during the inning.
- b. Players can be pitched to after the first 3 games of the season.
 - i. After the first three full games the coaches will begin pitching to the players.
 - ii. Each player will receive 5 pitches to hit the ball.
 - iii. If the player can't hit the ball, then the coach will bring in the Tee for the player to hit, no exceptions.
- c. Players shall advance bases station to station.
- d. Two (2) adult base coaches are allowed if there is one adult coach in the dugout.
- e. Player will not leave the base on an out.
- f. Bunting is not allowed

The Defensive Bylaw

- a. The defensive team shall place all players on the field. A maximum of six (6) players shall be on the infield at one time (pitcher, catcher, first baseman, second baseman, third baseman and short-stop). The remaining players shall be in the outfield.
- b. Coaches are allowed in the infield and outfield to provide coaching during the game.

Stolen Base Bylaw

There are no stolen bases in the T-ball Division.
